There are currently three Manitou forklifts in Simeulue, four in Nias (three in Gunung Sitoli, one in Lahewa) and five in Banda Aceh, supported by a number of duramats at various locations in NAD-Nias.

**Banda Aceh**

**UNORC KRF**

**(Kota/Kabupaten Recovery Forum)**

On 25 April 08, following a request from BRR to support the UNORC Kota/Kabupaten Recovery Forum (KRF), 27 WFP LSU Laptop units were handed over to BRR to support UNORC KRFs in 25 Districts/cities in Aceh and Nias.

**University of Syiah Kuala**

On 30 April 08, a meeting was held between WFP LSU, the Rector of the University of Syiah Kuala and BRR to discuss the establishment of an Institute of Maritime and Transport studies. The aim is that, on completion of the port management training, a resource center is established covering all aspects of maritime and port operations.

**Lhoknga (Aceh Besar)**

PT. Semen Andalas Indonesia - Lafarge is renting one Manitou forklift to support the discharge of craft paper in roll bundles. PT. Semen Andalas Indonesia / Lafarge have completed their second month rental period and have extended for a third month, into June 2008.

**Sabang**

The cruise ship MV. Maxim Gorky, with a capacity of 600 tourists, visited Sabang in April. The vessel is schedule to call on Sabang once a year, in a voyage that includes Phuket, Thailand and Colombo, Sri Lanka. The Custom and Immigration was done on board by Indonesian officers who boarded in Phuket. The vessel stayed for one day and passengers who completed Custom and Immigration procedures disembarked to visit the island. Due to weather conditions, the vessel later berthed in Belawan Port in April.

**Malahayati**

The third consignment of Pozolan (cement material) in bulk was shipped in April from Malahayati Port; a total of 4,000 mts were shipped to Sri Lanka. A tanker of 1,200 ton capacity carrying Bitumen arrived in Malahayati from Singapore on 25 April 08, to supply the Barge by loading ship to ship. The tanker carrying Bitumen to supply the Barge is scheduled to call at Malahayati three times per month. The Barge will also be used as floating storage for Bitumen. The Bitumen

**Nias**

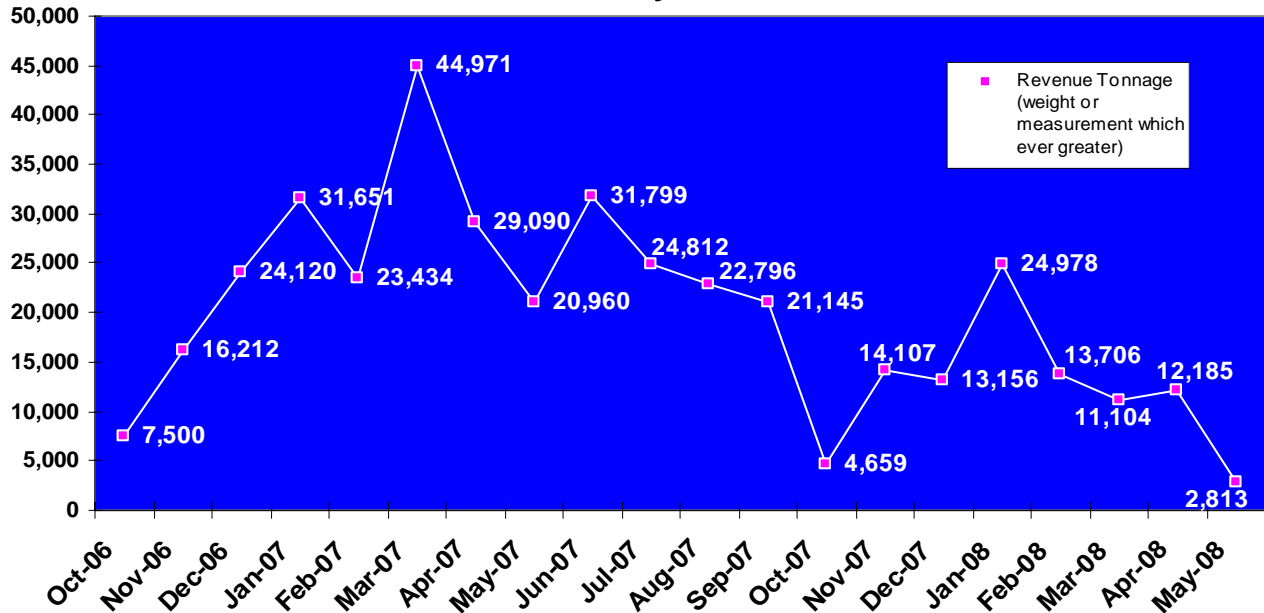

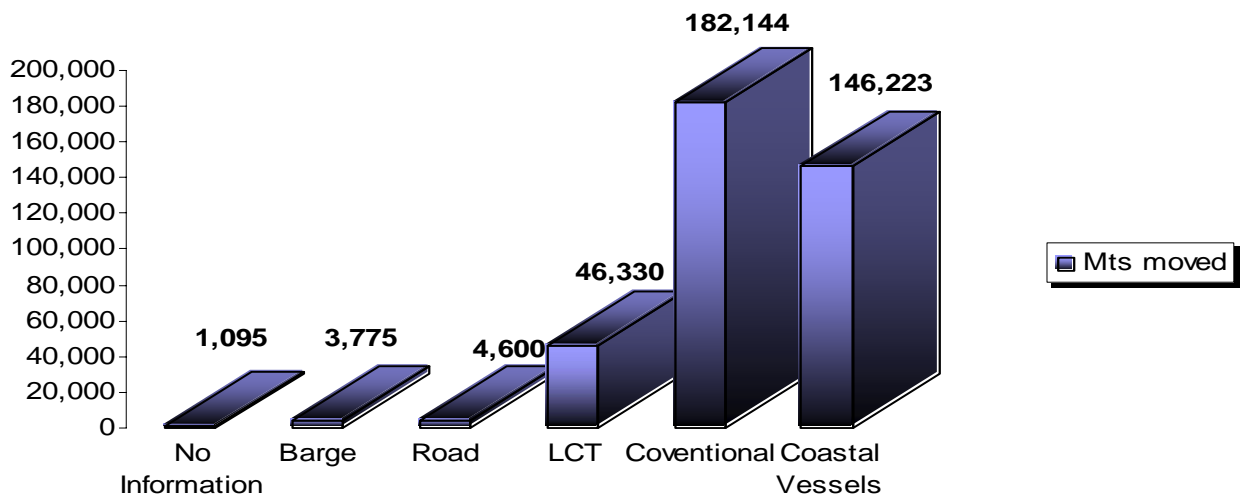
