World Food Programme operations now focus on:

Logistics Support	Providing logistics support & consultancy to private sector and humanitarian organizations operating in the NAD-Nias area; Rental of cargo handling equipment
Training and ports institutional capability	Assessing & evaluating ports & institutional capability, procuring and arranging training for staff located at 15 Ports in NAD - Nias
Identification and quantification of cargo prospects	Providing ‘latent’ cargo demand forecasting & developing a database of existing and potential cargo, linking port gateways to the hinterland and livelihood projects.

The operation has established offices and equipment located in Nias (Gunung Sitoli), Simeulue (Sinabang) and Banda Aceh (Ulee Lhee & Lhoknga)

Inauguration Port Capacity Development NAD – Nias 15 December 2008

The Port Capacity Development Training has been inaugurated. Husni Bahri TOB, SH, MM, M.Hum SEKDA NAD, represented the Governor of NAD. Also present was World Food Programme Indonesia Country Director Angela VanRynbach, Rector of Syiah Kuala University Prof. Darni M. Daud, Phd, Chairman and Managing Director of STET Maritime Singapore, BRR Teguh Pratomo, UN Agencies and all Port Managers in NAD – Nias.



In his written speech the representative the Governor of NAD thanked the World Food Programme for conducting the Port Capacity Development Training, and his expectation was that through this Port Training the ports management performance will improve significantly. The Rector of Syiah Kuala University stated that the Port Management Training has the potential to improve the port environment and boost the economy of NAD - Nias

At the end of the inauguration the attendees surveyed the class room facilities.

The opening class of the Port Management Training, “Senior Manager Induction Programme” commenced at 16 Dec 08 and ended 18 Dec 08 with 30 participants receiving attendance certificates signed by the World Food Programme implementing partner, STET Singapore and the Rector of Syiah Kuala University. The next class will resume on Jan 05, 2009.
