### OVERVIEW - CURRENT OPERATIONS

World Food Programme operations now focus on:

Logistics Support	Providing logistics support & consultancy to private sector and humanitarian organizations operating in the NAD-Nias area; Rental of cargo handling equipment
Training and ports institutional capability	Assessing & evaluating ports & institutional capability, procuring and arranging training for staff located at 18 Ports in NAD - Nias
Identification and quantification of cargo prospects	Providing 'latent' cargo demand forecasting & developing a database of existing and potential cargo, linking port gateways to the hinterland and livelihood projects.

The operation has established offices and equipment located in Nias (Gunung Sitoli) Simeulue (Sinabang) and Banda Aceh (Ulee Lhee, University of Syiah Kuala and Lhoknga)

### Capacity Development

#### Port Training

As at the 15 of July 09, 327 participants from 18 ports were trained in 22 different modules, at the end of each course, the Certificates were handed out by members of various United Nations Agencies present in NAD - Nias.



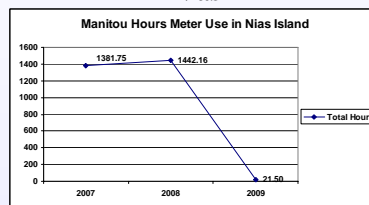

#### LOGISTICS SUPPORT

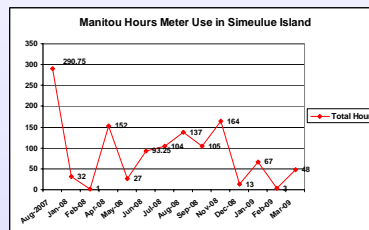
The Requirements and the use of our Manitou equipment has reduced to virtually non existent levels on the Island of Nias and Simeulue.

Thus a strategic decisions has been made to deploy all of the equipment to Banda Aceh where it will be stored and available for use. In addition, in terms of our mandate the equipment will eventually be released to organizations within NAD - Nias for the use in existing and future projects. There are, of course, some conditions regarding the release of such equipment.

#### Latent Cargo Forecasting

WFP LSU has distributed to all ports in NAD - Nias, a comprehensive CD of cargo and passenger data compiled from 18 ports.

The CD's also contain presentation given to participants at the port training class.



#### Lhoknga (Aceh Besar)

Two Manitou forklift units are currently utilized by PT. Semen Andalas Indonesia at the Lhoknga complex. In agreement PT. Semen Andalas Indonesia has extended their rental request until the end of August 2009.

#### Malahayati

The extended wharf (140 long by 26 metres wide) at Port Malahayati is still under construction, scheduled for completion at end of August 2009, along with dredging work.

### Sabang

The next schedule export of Fine Iron Ore in bulk is in July on a bulk carrier with DWT capacity 6000 metric ton. This we understand may be last shipment.

The Fine Iron Ore, originated from Calang and shipped to Sabang by Barge, stored at an open storage in Sabang Port pending final export.

### Nias

47 Duramats are utilized by IFRC NGO; 18 July 2009 IFRC have completed one year rental period for support their Watsan project in Nias.

47 Duramats was installed at their warehouse in Alora, Nias Island.

### New Ferry Service

PT.ASDP Indonesia Ferry introduced their new ferry RoRo service linking Sibolga – Teluk Dalam – Tello Island, the maiden voyage was on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2009, with a provisional weekly schedule Sibolga – Teluk Dalam and one voyage every two weeks Sibolga – Teluk Dalam – Tello Island.

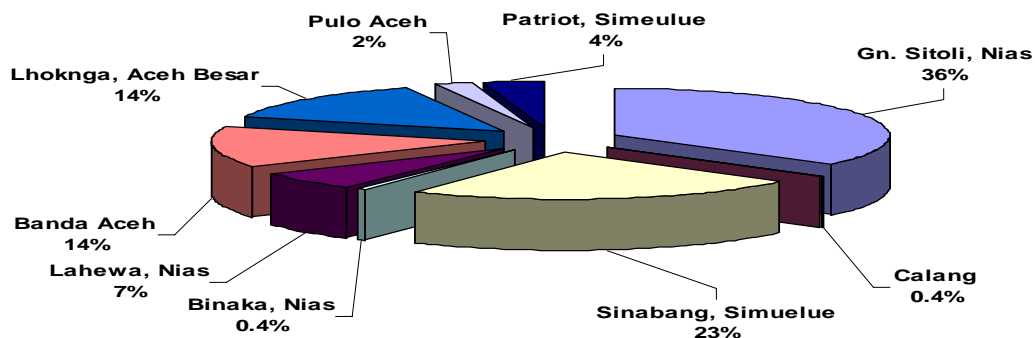
