Capacity Development Training

The Official closing ceremony of the first phase of the project was held on the 5th of February in the departure lounge of Ulee Lhee ferry port. The following dignitaries attended: Said Mustafa, representing the Governor of NAD; World Food Programme Deputy Regional Director Peter French, World Food Programme Indonesia; World Food Programme Country Director Coco Ushiyama; Professor Darusman, representing the Rector of Unsyiah Kuala University; the Project Manager and Technical Director of STET Maritime Singapore, UN Agencies, and all Port Managers in NAD – Nias and training participants were among the invitees.

In his written speech the representative of the Governor of NAD thanked the World Food Programme for conducting the Port Capacity Development Training, and his expectation was that through this Port Training the ports management performance will improve significantly. The Rector of Syiah Kuala University stated that the Port Management Training has the potential to improve the port environment and boost the economy of NAD - Nias

Phase two of the Port Capacity Development project consists of three additional modules: Containerization; Operation and Maintenance; and Monitoring and Evaluation. The venue for Phase two of the training project will be the WFP LSU office in Banda Aceh. The opening class of the Port Management Training phase two, "Containerization and International Best Practices" is scheduled to commence on 22 March 2010 and end on 27 March 2010 with 25 participants receiving attendance certificates signed by the World Food Programme implementing partner, ECORYS Netherland and the Rector of Syiah Kuala University.
