WFP SS and the UN's response to the floods in Tamiang District

WFP SS has assisted in the planning and early implementation of the UN's response to floods in Tamiang District, North Aceh.

From the onset of the UN intervention in Tamiang District, WFP SS has provided personnel and vehicle assistance. As early as Sunday the 24th WFP SS sent two vehicles and staff from Medan to check road access to the effected district. The mission reported on road conditions and gathered information from local authorities. This information helped in the logistics planning of the UN operation. At the same time, WFP SS was able to assist WFP in loading food for the first helicopter trip to the effected district. WFP SS also plans to send a mission out this week to help support UN coordination in Kula Simpang.

Operation Overview – Restructure of WFP Shipping Service Began

WFP Shipping Service had redelivered Labitra Adinda on 19 December 2006, bringing the size of the fleet to 3 vessels. Currently WFP Shipping Service are in the process of transition to commercial operators, which will result in restructure the operation. Two more LCT will be let go during Jan. 07 as WFP Shipping Service have not received any further funding.

WFP Shipping Service will also reduce the international staff by between 30-35% in the first quarter of 2007.

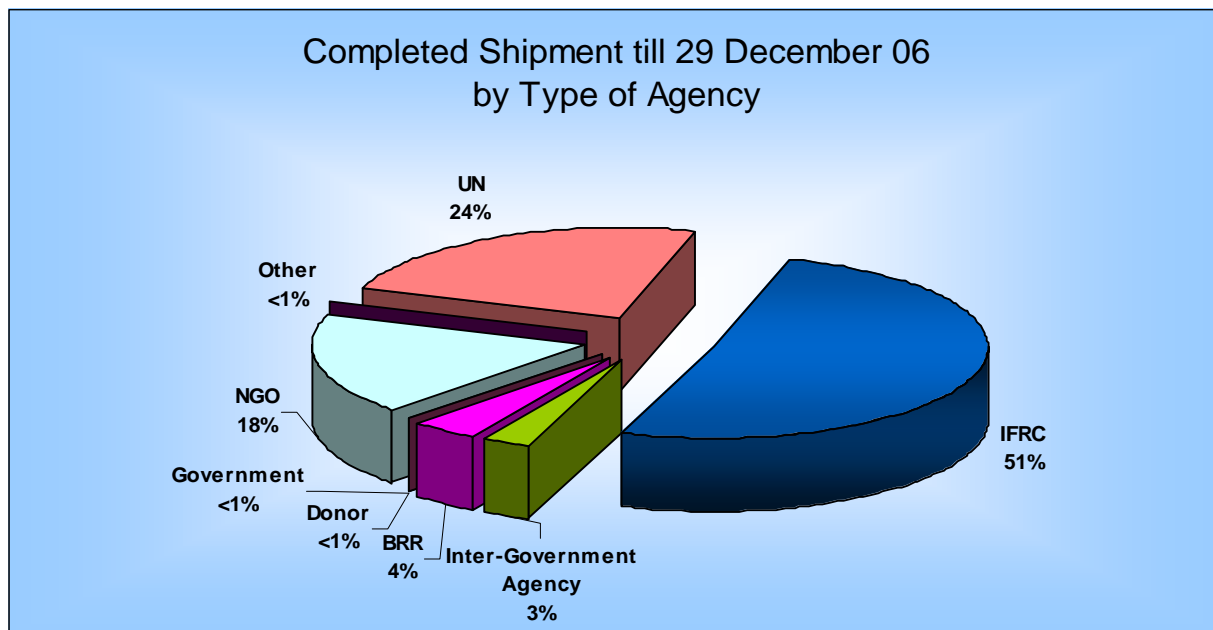
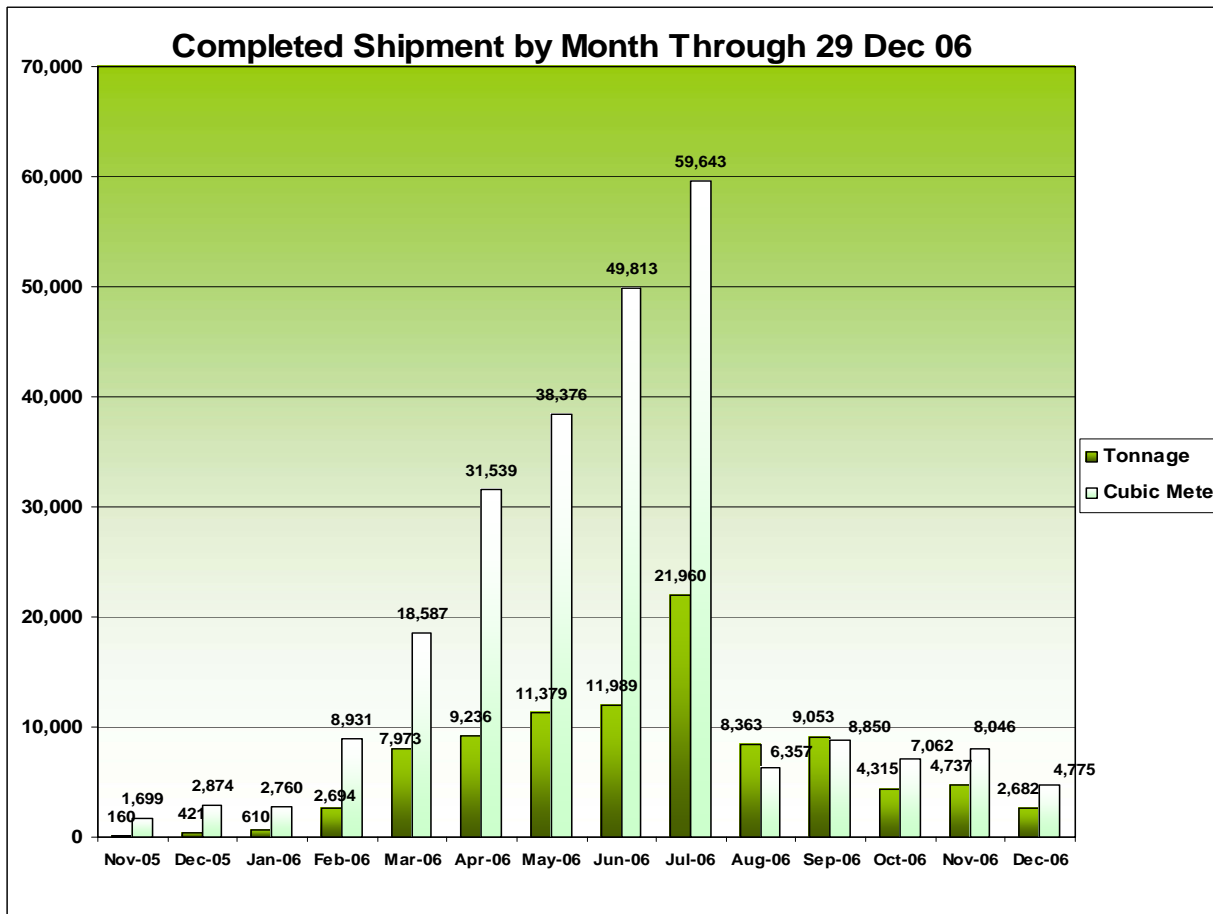
Simeulue

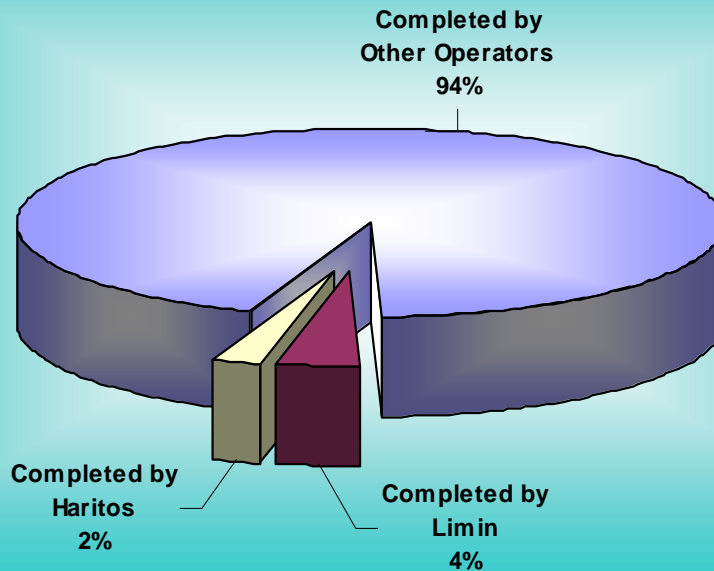

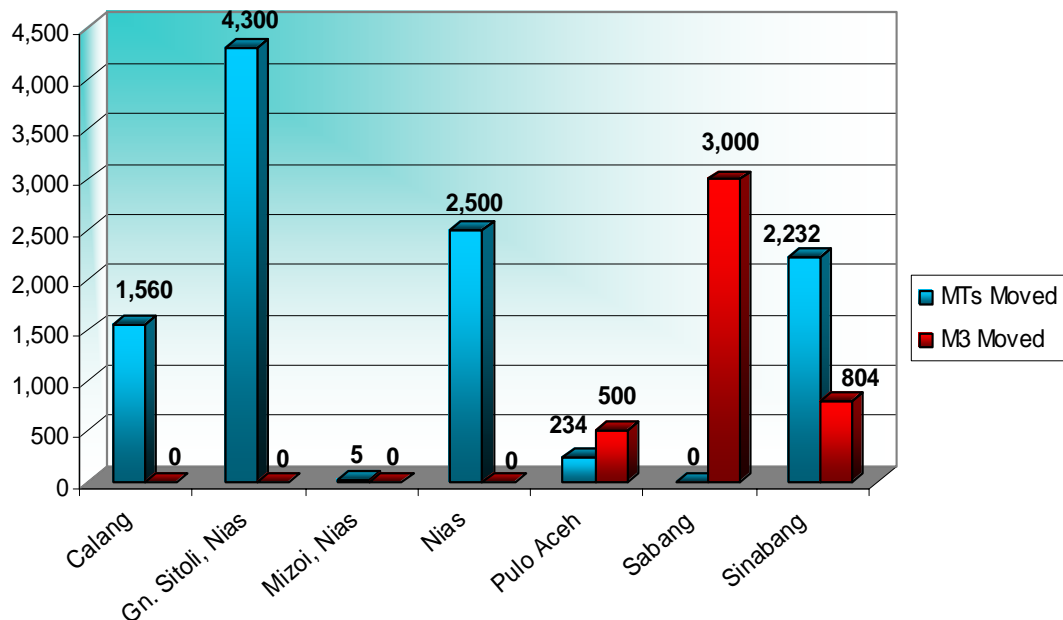
